Did You Know?

While most students earn a unit dfploma credit through successful completion of a unit of study aligned to the commencement level learning standards, there are alternative means for students to earn diploma credit including:

- f Credit by examination
- f Credit by participation
- *f* Independent study or elective credit
- *f* Dual or Concurrent enrollment in college coursework

Did You Know?

While the rest of New York State awards one unit of diploma credit for one unit of study, the New York City (NYC) Department of Education (DOE) awards one unit of diploma credit for one half unit of study. Stop 4: Assessment Requirements

Explain:

In addition to the 22 units of credit, students must also meet the NYS assessment requirements to earn a diploma.

To meet the assessment requiremention Regents or local diplomatudents mustuccessfully complete 4assessments-1 pathwayAll students must pass one assessment (Regents exam or Departmentapproved alternative) in each of the four disciplines (English, mathematics, science, social studies) plus one pathway.

In order to complete the TEM Pathwaya student must obtain a passing score on one additional Regents exam or Department proved alternative in mathematics or science

In order to complete **Q**ion 2 for the CDOS pathway, a student must meet the requirements for one of the <u>Departmentapproved Pathway Assessments in Career</u> <u>Development and Occupational Studies</u>

If students are not able to earn a passing score of 65 on Regents exams, they may be eligible for appeals, safety nets, and/or Superintendent DeterminatToypically, students who avail themselves of these options receiver at approved local diploma instead of a Regents Diploma.Information about these options can be found in <u>New York State Graduation</u> Requirements: Additional Optioflyer.

Stop 5: Types of Diplomas

Stop 6: Seals & Endorsements

Explain:

To acknowledge students who go above and beyond the minimum diploma requirements in certain areasthe current regulations allow for a variety of recognitions to be added to a student's diploma in the form of seals and endorsements

The technical endorsement can be added to any diploma type (local, Regents, or Regents with Advanced Designation) for any student who completes a Departapproved Career and Technical Education (CTE) program inolgithe threepart technical assessment in addition to the minimum diploma requirements.

The Seal of Biliteracy can be added to either the Regents diploma or the Regents with Advanced Designation.
